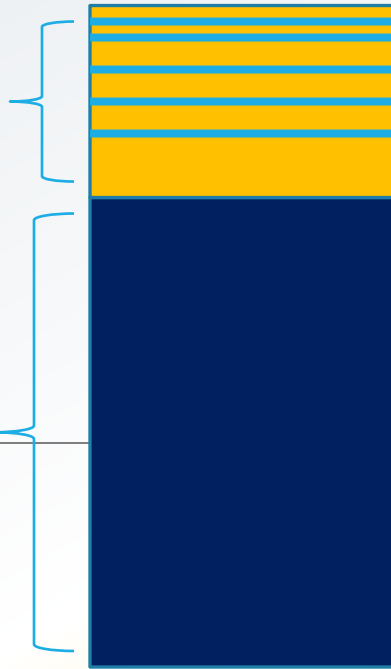

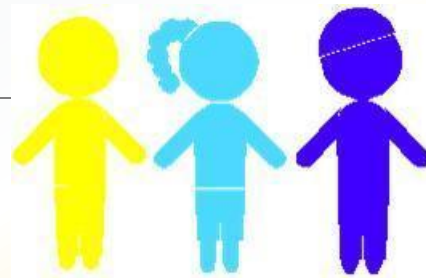

- KLA's LCAP will involve all stakeholders and will be updated yearly.

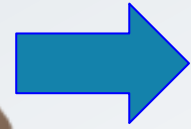
